1) This table is intended to inform policy discussion. It is not intended to provide guidance to students as to the full set of requirements for any of the senior secondary certificates and should not be relied upon in that regard.
2) It appears all states have some arrangement for advanced students to count some university study towards their senior secondary certificate, but these are not separately listed here.

Note that since the TCE is **standards** based rather than **content** or '**provider** specific' based, (you don't have to go to school to get the TCE and you don't have to do particular subjects at school), it appears to be the most flexible and inclusive of the senior secondary certificates.
